

Intensive Beginners'/Foundation Stage

The course is targeted at students with no – or little prior knowledge of German. Teaching is communicative, employing a variety of media. The Foundation Stage includes the orientation course, teaching the basics of German politics, history and culture, as well as a computer course.
Group size: 14 – 18 people

Graduation: Certificate in German = Level B 1 of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages: Learning, Teaching, Assessment (CEFR)

Daytime course: (25 hours per week)

- Total duration: 6.5 months = 630 hrs.

Evening course: (12 hours per week)

- Duration of each course stage: 6 months = 300 /330 hrs.

Intensive Intermediate Stage I–III (DSH)

The course is targeted at students with sound basic knowledge of German (a minimum of 500 teaching hours). The course systematically repeats, details and expands upon the key areas of grammar, teaches the use of complex sentence structures and techniques of listening and reading comprehension, and system-atically trains written and verbal expression by lexical means.
Group size: 10 – 15 people

Graduation: The pass certificate corresponds to **Level C 1** of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages: Learning, Teaching, Assessment and qualifies students to take the **'Deutsche Sprachprüfung für den Hochschulzugang' (DSH)** framework examination for access to higher education in Germany or the **TestDAF** German as a Foreign Language examination.
These examinations are prerequisites for higher education studies in Germany.

Daytime course (20 hours per week)

- Total duration: approx. 6 months = 480 teaching hours
- Duration of each course stage: approx. 2 months = 160 teaching hours

Evening course (12 hours per week)

Organization

Registration: In person, by e-mail or post.

Visa: We will issue you with a confirmation of registration in order to obtain a visa.

Accommodation: We can help you find lodgings or a host family to stay with on request.

Classification: All students are tested, classified and advised of their learning requirements prior to starting the course. The test and consultation are free of charge.

Fees: The fees for each segment of the course must be paid in cash at our office or may be transferred directly to our bank account, provided no bank charges are incurred by us. There is no entitlement to reserve a place on the course until fees have been received.

Cancellation: Participation in the course may be cancelled giving four weeks' notice to the end of each course segment (= 100 hours).

Minimum number of participants: The courses can only be held if a sufficient number of participants have registered by one week prior to the start of the course. If not, the course may be cancelled.

One-on-one teaching is possible in all course stages by consultation. Price: 28.00 € per hour.

Stuttgart lies in the heart of the Baden-Württemberg region in southern Germany, and has a population of around 600 thousand. The city is renowned as being the home to high-tech companies such as DaimlerChrysler, Porsche and IBM. The region around Stuttgart has one of the highest densities of scientific, academic and research institutions. Nowhere else in Germany are more patents registered than here,

especially in the engineering and IT fields. Over 11% of all research and development expenditure in Germany is invested in the region. As well as its two universities, Stuttgart has six Institutes of the Fraunhofer Society, two Max Planck Institutes and numerous technical colleges and other centers of higher education. Stuttgart is also a great center of culture. Historic palaces, theaters, museums and huge areas of parkland complement the beautiful old city center, which also features one of Germany's longest pedestrian zones.
